Dear Parents & Caregivers,

International Women's Day was celebrated throughout the world on Monday.

Charlotte Freedman and Chiara Lo Pilato went to the Young Women's Leadership Seminar at the Parliament of New South Wales for International Women's Day. They reported, "we heard from four inspirational women leaders. Rae Cooper, a Professor of gender work and employment relations at Sydney University gave us advice on how to function in workplaces mainly dominated by men. It was incredibly inspiring and we were able to ask her questions ranging from how to overcome gender barriers to including men in the conversation of gender equality.

Afterward, we got the opportunity to talk to three female members of the legislative council: Rose Jackson from the Labor party, Catherine Cusack from the Liberal party, and Abigail Boyd from the Greens party. They talked to us about the inclusion of women from all different backgrounds including LGBTQIA+ women, disabled women, and women of colour. They all gave us uplifting speeches about female empowerment and how to empower ourselves, not just in terms of sexism but also in terms of job choice and freedom of expression, talking about the importance of integrity and standing up for yourself and other women.

Overall, it was incredible to sit in the legislative chamber, surrounded by the busts of past male leaders, sitting alongside the new generation of female leaders who are all passionate about learning about and fighting for women's rights just as we are." The theme of "Choose to Challenge" and calling out gender bias and inequality is a message supported by all at Reddam.



On Sunday the Year 11 students, under the watchful eye of Ms Vince and Mr Francis, took part in the Amazing Race as the first part of their leadership camp. This year, the race was centralised at Centennial Park and Mr. Francis had them doing numerous challenges as they raced around all four corners of the park.

My thanks to Ms Vince and her team of teachers who all contributed to the camp's success.

The quality of the performances was inspirational and students reacted to the trust placed in them by being true ambassadors of the school. Mrs. Wood, Mr. Tallis and Mr. O'Mahony could not have been prouder of their students and reported that "the students were amazing and the best behaved of all the school groups who were there. All the coach drivers and staff at the event were commenting on how mature they all were. What a fantastic experience."

Next week on Tuesday sees the first Seminar Day of the year for Middle School students. The concept of doing fieldwork is integral to students becoming more aware of learning opportunities outside of the classroom.

The Year 7 excursion to Centennial Park includes a geographical investigation with an orienteering activity. This program provides a fieldwork/data collection opportunity on urban wetlands alongside an opportunity to put their map reading and navigation skills to the test through an orienteering exercise.

Year 8 students will be taking part in a cultural awareness and integration program held at the Sydney Jewish Museum Education Centre. This excursion will facilitate a broader understanding of multiculturalism within Australia.

Year 9 History students will go to the Museum of Sydney to take part in a day of interactive learning and source analysis as part of their just-completed 'Movements of People' unit. It will be an amazing opportunity to engage with local, state, and national Australia's history, compare the experiences of convicts, free settlers and Aboriginal people to that of those in Europe, Africa and the United States and to apply skills and feedback from their recent cycle test

Year 9 Geographers will be participating in an educationally rich excursion to the Royal Botanic Garden. Students will appreciate the timeline of food in Australia from Aboriginal culture to First Farm, then numerous cultural groups who have settled here, to the reintroduction of indigenous ingredients into our cuisine to create

'bush foods'. Students will also conduct fieldwork to assess the changes, impacts, and management of the Royal Botanic Garden.

Some student achievements this week include:

Arabella Raetze took part in the Shoalhaven Equestrian Jump Club Competition. It was her first-ever competition and she did her rounds flawlessly, qualifying for the Interschools competition where she will represent Reddam. Well done to Bella and her horse Rocky.



Frankie Kogan had tremendous success at the Theatre Arts Titles Eisteddfods competition on Sunday.

He and his dance partner won their duo/trio dance category dancing a Latin combo routine (the only thing he competed in on the day apart from partnering Janie) and were also selected for the Championships round where they received the Rising Star award.




### **CDSSA TENNIS CHAMPIONS**
